Dr. Harwood, a veteran explorer who has just returned from a lengthy sojourn in the heart of the African jungles, will bring with him approximately twenty five of his captive animals. These beasts will be on display during the performance and will be used in the show.

Critics have acclaimed Dr. Harwood's performance as one of high calibre and Mr. Cox states that he has been assured of a sparkling exhibition. Harwood has spent more than twenty-five years in the wilds of Africa, trapping and taming wild beasts.
